CONCURRENTLY with the May meetings at Exeter Hall, the commencement of the Italian Opera season, and the general revival of life among the Upper Ten Thousand, we have the anniversaries of the institutions intimately associated with the literary world of the metropolis, and there is, we hear, a prospect of most successful gatherings both for the Literary Fund and the Printers' Pension Corporation. Mr. Millais will, as we have already announced, preside at the dinner of the Literary Fund, which has only nine years to run before it will invite its supporters to celebrate its centenary. The banquet takes place next Wednesday in Willis's Rooms, and art, literature, and statecraft will alike be represented. Among the members of the two Houses of the legislature whose names appear in the list of stewards are the Duke of Westminster, the Master of the Horse under the new administration; Mr. William Agnew, the newly-elected member for Manchester; Sir Henry James, Q.C., M.P.,

the Attorney-General; Mr. Cunliffe Brooks, M.P.; Mr. John Pender, M.P.; and Mr. Villiers Stuart, M.P. Among the eminent authors who will serve as stewards are Mr. Anthony Trollope, Canon Robertson, and Mr. Tom Taylor. Science will be represented by Professor Huxley. Art will have, in addition to the president of the evening, some of its foremost professors at the Board, including Mr. Calderon, R.A.; Mr. Britton Rivière, A.R.A.; Mr. G. F. Watts, R.A.; Mr. John MacWhirter, A.R.A.; Sir John Gilbert, R.A.; and the Chevalier Desanges. The other names of note on the stewards' list include Lord O'Neill, the Rev. W. H. Milman, Mr. Thomas Chappell, Lord Justice James, the Rev. John Troutbeck, and Dr. Harrington Tuke. Under such auspices the anniversary can scarcely fail to be a success, and it will, we trust, result in a large addition to the fund which has such strong claims upon the support of all who have any connection with the world of letters. At the anniversary of the Printers' Pension Corporation, on Tuesday week, the 11th instant, at Freemasons' Tavern, the Lord Mayor will preside, and it is expected that Sir Francis Truscott will be supported by the sheriffs and other civic dignitaries, and by the leading representatives of the trade.

An Exhibition, which will have a special interest for all members of the Printing and Publishing Trade, is to be held at the Agricultural Hall from July 5 to July 17, comprising machinery, implements, and material used or sold by Printers, Stationers, Papermakers, and kindred traders. A copy of every newspaper published in the United Kingdom will be exhibited. Any profits resulting from the Exhibition will be handed over to the Printers' Pension, Almshouse, and Orphan Asylum Corporation. The patrons of the undertaking include the Lord Mayors of London and Dublin, the Provosts of Edinburgh and Glasgow, Dr. Cameron, M.P., President of the Company of Stationers of Glasgow, Mr. John Walter, M.P., Mr. Edward Lloyd, Mr. W. J. Ingram, M.P., Messrs. Spottiswoode & Co., Messrs. Eyre & Spottiswoode, Messrs. Waterlow Bros. & Layton, Messrs. Bemrose & Sons, Messrs. Clowes & Son (Limited), Messrs. Waterlow & Sons (Limited), Messrs. Marcus Ward & Co., and other firms. The Exhibition, which is to include a market, is to be of a purely trade character, and will have a special interest for the provincial trade, as it will enable them to enter into friendly competition with the London firms. As the Printers' Corporation is still insufficiently supported, the Almshouse Fund showing by the last balance-sheet a debt of £67 still due to the treasurer, we trust that the financial results of the Exhibition will enable its projectors to hand over a substantial amount to the treasurer. Whether it is a wise course to make no awards to the exhibitors is, we think, a matter well worthy of the reconsideration of the directors of the Exhibition.

Messrs. W. H. Allen & Co. will publish during May 'A Pleasure Trip to India and Ceylon,' with photographs, by Mrs. M. E. Corbet. 'Indian Industries,' by A. G. F. Eliot James. 'The Conjuror's Daughter,' a tale, by J. W. Sherer, author of 'Who is Mary?' 'The Garden of India,' Chapters on Oudh, by H. C. Irwin. 'Twenty-one Days in India,' the Tour of Sir Ali Baba. 'Picked Up in the Streets:' Sketches of London Life, by Richard Rowe, illustrated. 'Indian Reminiscences,' by Colonel White, with photographs. 'The Challenge of Barletta,' by D'Azeglio, in English by Lady Louisa Magenit. 'Destruction of Life by Snakes, Hydrophobia, &c., in Western India,' by an Ex-Commissioner. 'Round Europe with the Crowd.'

Messrs. Hurst & Blackett will publish in May a new novel by Mrs. Molesworth, author of 'Hathercourt Rectory,' entitled 'Miss Bouverie,' in 3 vols., and 'Mervyn O'Connor,' by the Earl of Desart, author of 'Kilverdale,' in 3 vols.

Messrs Griffith and Farran will publish immediately a new book by Ascott R. Hope, entitled 'Seven Stories about Old Folks and Young Ones.' A common idea runs through them all, viz., that of exhibiting young people and old people in some natural relations with the purpose of showing that they often fail to understand each other from want of sympathy, and that in the case of both it is as true as ever, that more evil is wrought by the want of thought than ever by want of heart.

The new issue of the *Edinburgh Review* has an important article on Ritualistic Literature, and the *Quarterly* has an equally noteworthy paper on the Book of Common Prayer.

The promoters of the Topographical Society of London, have, we hear, received most encouraging promises of support.

Messrs. Sampson Low & Co. have just published, under the editorship of Lord Ronald Gower, F.S.A., one of the trustees of the National Portrait Gallery, the first part of a work of great interest and importance, entitled 'The Great Historic Galleries of England.' Each number is to contain three photographs of famous pictures in the galleries of the English nobility.

An early number of the *Magazine of Art* will contain a paper on 'Queen Victoria and Art,' which, by the express permission of her Majesty, will be illustrated by copies of sketches by her Majesty and by the Prince Consort.

Mr. Tennyson has chosen the somewhat singular, if realistically expressive, [title of 'De Profundis' for his poem in the May number of the *Nineteenth Century*. It is in effect a welcome to a baby.



Victor Hugo's new poem, 'Religions et Religion,' has just appeared at Paris. Beginning, like the 'Châtiments,' in a tone of comedy and irony, it reviews creeds and systems, passes from Catholicism to Nihilism, and concludes by an affirmation of a Theism without catechisms, korans, and grammars.

In a Convocation, held at Oxford on Tuesday, a grant was made to the Nottingham Free Library, of books printed at the University Press, to the value of £100.

In a recently-published work on Mr. Gladstone, the author, Mr. Pennant, makes a singular blunder when he speaks of the Premier-expectant as 'enjoying at *Hughenden* the evening of a well-spent life'!

The proprietors of the *Graphic* have arranged to issue, as a supplement to the paper of May 1, a map of the United Kingdom, coloured so as to indicate the political complexion borne by the counties and boroughs in the Parliament about to meet.

The third annual congress of the International Literary Association is announced to be held at Lisbon on July 1 and four following days. It will be under the presidency of the King of Portugal. Particulars of the business to be transacted and of the fêtes to be held will shortly be published.

On Saturday week the Dean of Westminster received and conducted through the Abbey a select party of about 70 of the men employed in the printing works of Messrs. Cassell, Petter, Galpin, & Co. After pointing out to them the principal objects of interest, and briefly indicating their historical associations, the Dean provided them with an abundant tea, served in the Jerusalem Chamber. He referred to the connexion of Caxton's name with the Abbey, and stated that the printing-press was not erected within the walls of the Abbey itself, as is sometimes supposed, but within the bounds of the adjoining almonry. Warm thanks were offered to the Dean for his kindness.

Mr. Denny Wilson's 'Life of John Wesley' is shortly to be published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

One of those amusing misprints which occasionally happen, even under the careful sub-editing of Printing House Square, occurs in the advertisement sheet of yesterday's *Times*, where Mr. C. K. Salaman, the well-known composer, is announced to read a paper on 'Music as a Profession' before the *Medical Society* of London.

The Rev. John Julian has, we understand, made great progress with his Dictionary of Hymnology, which is to be published by Mr. Murray.

The Rev. Benjamin Webb, Vicar of St. Andrew's, Wells Street, one of the earliest pioneers in the æsthetic revival within the English Church, has, we understand, succeeded Canon Ashwell as editor of the *Church Quarterly Review*.

The Queen has granted a pension of £150 to Mr. S. C. Hall, in recognition of his long and great services to art and literature.

The issue of the Monthly Army List, which was 'kept standing,' is suspended, owing to the fire at Messrs. Roworth & Sons, Newton Street, Holborn.

Lord Desart is the new proprietor of *Vanity Fair*, in succession to Mr. Bowles.

Mr. Borthwick, proprietor of the *Morning Post*, has received the honour of knighthood.

An International Printers' Congress is to be held at Brussels on the 18th and 19th of July.

A new liberal daily paper is it is said likely to be one of the firstfruits of Mr. Gladstone's return to power.

The last annual report of the Leeds Free Library is a remarkable document. We give two extracts, which speak for themselves, only adding that there are now twenty branches in active operation. The Library was established in 1866. 'One of the most remarkable features connected with the branches is the success attending the Sheepscar Library since its enlargement and re-opening. At that Library there has been issued during the year a total number of books equal to nearly one-fifth of the issues of the Central Library. . . . There has been an increase of 2,000 borrowers at the branches; 10,898 readers have qualified this year, as against 8,896 last year, the average issue to each reader having reached 28·91 volumes.'

All travellers on the continent,—and that is almost saying everybody—are under a debt to Mr. Charles Dickens for the ingenious arrangement by which, in his time tables, he has done away with the necessity for printing the letters p.m. and a.m. to show what time of day or night the figures in his time tables refer to. All afternoon time up to midnight stands in dark figures. Thus 1.30 means half-past one in the morning, 1.30 half-past one of the afternoon. The wonder is, of course, that so beautifully simple an arrangement should not have occurred to any one before. A clumsy attempt, as it may be called, in this direction is the dark lines which surround the dark hours in the time table of the Rhine steamboats. Just as a clock which stands still is sure to indicate the time twice in the twenty-four hours, the dark lines are partially right, but the tables are printed to last several months, and therefore must be incorrect as to the darkness and the daylight very materially.

Amongst the latest literary ventures in America is the *Hour*, a weekly journal devoted to 'social interests.' Among the headings of its contents are 'Minutes and seconds,' 'Chiffon gossip,' 'From friends abroad,' 'From friends at home,' reviews of new books &c.; altogether an agreeable repertory of the sort that has amusement for its chief aim. An interesting account of the Hopes, the Dutch Rothschilds, is given in the number before us.

Mr. George Rivers sends us a catalogue extending to sixty pages of second-hand works relating chiefly to Africa, America, China, Australasia, Japan, the West Indies, &c.

AMERICAN NEWS AND NOTES.

Messrs. H. C. Baird & Co., Philadelphia, will publish at once a work on the 'Slide Valve Practically Explained,' by Joshua Rose, author of 'The Complete Practical Machinist.'

Messrs. A. G. Brown & Co., Boston, will have ready this month 'My Southern Home,' a description of inside life in the Southern States, extending back as far as fifty years, by Dr. W. Wells Brown, author of 'The Negro in the Rebellion' &c.

The *New York Times*, in a recent issue, says :—'Mr. William Cushing, who has shown remarkable ability in the direction of an index to the *North American Review*, has been at work for nearly two years upon a Biographical Dictionary, to be called 'The Century of Authors,' which will contain a list of the full names of all persons entitled to a place in a library catalogue during the past one hundred years—1780–1880. The work is intended to be exhaustive so far as the United States is concerned, but not so in the case of Great Britain and the rest of the world.'

Messrs. Fords, Howard, & Hulbert, New York, will publish during the month a book in which Henry (Chevalier) Wikoff, under the title of 'Reminiscences of an Idler,' gives the remembrances of the people he has met in his varied life, from President Jackson, Aaron Burr, and the great men of that time in America; with a host of celebrities of France, England, and the Continent in Europe, down to these latter days.

Mr. John Fiske's lectures, both new and old, will shortly find their place in a volume which will bear the title of 'America's Place in History.'

A new edition of Shakspeare's Works, with a Life of the Poet, edited by the Rev. Henry N. Hudson, in twenty duodecimo volumes, with a double set of notes, the explanatory at the foot of each page and the critical at the end of each volume, is announced by Messrs. Ginn & Heath, the Boston publishers.

Messrs. Gebbie & Barrie, Philadelphia, will soon begin issuing in parts 'The Art Treasures of America,' selected and described from public and private collections by 'Edward Strahan' (Mr. Earl Shinn). Each part will contain two photogravures, a full-page woodcut, and facsimiles in the text of artist's sketches and studies for the works described.

In response to popular demand, Messrs. Biglow & Main, New York, will issue immediately a book of new Sunday School Songs entitled 'Good as Gold,' by Rev. R. Lowry & W. H. Doane. This work will also contain contributions from many other well-known and popular Sunday School Song writers. Copies of it are to be had from Messrs. Sampson Low & Co., who are the recognised English agents for the book. A list of other popular Sunday School Hymn-books sold by them to be had on application.

Mr. H. D. Minot, author of the 'Land and Game Birds of New England,' will shortly issue a little book, through A. Williams & Co., Boston, entitled 'The Diary of a Bird freely Translated into Human Language.'

The Rev. George W. Cooke, of Indianapolis, Ind., has nearly ready for publication 'A Study of Emerson.' The volume will contain some thirty topics relating to the life and works of R. W. Emerson, among them his ancestry, early life and ministry; his home life, social relations, lectures, essays, and growing fame; his conduct in war time; his literary methods, and his views of God, man, and immortality.

Messrs. Harper & Bros., who are now publishing Dr. Henry M. Dexter's 'Congregationalism of the Last Three Hundred Years, as seen in its Literature,' have in press a 'Cyclopædia of American History,' by Benson J. Lossing. This firm also announce the following

works for early publication, viz., 'The Theory of Thought,' a treatise on Deductive Logic, by Prof. Noah K. Davis, of the University of Virginia; 'The Life and Letters of Horace Bushnell, D.D.,' with two portraits; 'Historical Studies of Church Building in the Middle Ages' (Venice, Siena, Florence), by Charles Eliot Norton; and the first volume of Dr. Wm. M. Thomson's 'Southern Palestine and Jerusalem;' and for their 'Library of American Fiction,' a new novel entitled 'The Virginia Bohemians,' by John Esten Cooke.

Messrs. Houghton, Osgood, & Co., Boston, will publish immediately, 'American Prose,' a companion volume to 'American Poetry,' and, like it, edited, with Introductions and Notes, by Horace E. Scudder. It will contain entire stories or essays selected from the works of Hawthorne, Irving, Longfellow, Whittier, Holmes, Lowell, Thoreau, and Emerson. The same firm have in the press the 'History and Traditions of Marblehead,' (Mass.) by Samuel Roads, with heliotype illustrations, and 'Every Day English,' by Richard Grant White, reprinted from the *New York Times*.

Mr. Charles G. Leland ('Hans Breitmann') has a volume in press entitled 'Minor Arts,' written with the object of enforcing the superiority of hand-work over machine-work in art. The work will be profusely embellished with illustrations by the author.

Messrs. J. B. Lippincott & Co., Philadelphia, have in press for early publication Jackson's 'Valley Campaign,' a history of the campaign of General T. J. (Stonewall) Jackson in the Valley of Virginia, 1861-62, by Lieut.-Col. William Allan, U.S.A., with full maps of the regions and battlefields; the 'Summerland Sketches, or Rambles in the Backwoods of Mexico and Central America,' by Felix L. Oswald, profusely illustrated, which have formed an agreeable feature of their magazine; 'New England Bygones,' by E. H. Arr; 'The United States Government: its Organisation and Practical Workings,' by George N. Lamphere; a new edition of 'Louis A. Duhring's Practical Treatise on Diseases of the Skin,' illustrated; and 'The Great Living Men of Our Country,' being a dictionary of biographical notices of the distinguished living characters of the United States.

Messrs. D. Lothrop & Co., Boston, will shortly begin the publication of a series of illustrated volumes of travel and observation in foreign lands, entitled the 'Library of Entertaining History,' the whole under the editorship of Mr. Arthur Gilman. 'India,' by Mrs. Fannie R. Feudge; 'Egypt,' by Mrs. Clara Erskine Clement, the art writer; 'Switzerland,' by Mrs. Julia S. Tutwiler, of Alabama; 'Scandinavia,' by Mr. Chas. E. Hurd, literary editor of the *Boston Evening Transcript*; and 'Spain,' by Prof. James A. Harrison, are among the volumes projected.

Prof. Caine, of Cornell University, an accomplished Italian scholar, has been for some years engaged in making a collection of the popular tales of Italy as specially designated as folk-lore. The work is now so far advanced that it will be completed in a few months. It will contain an introduction on popular tales in general, and those of Italy in particular, a full bibliography, and copious notes.

Messrs. Phillips & Hunt, New York, will publish shortly 'Dio the Athenian: or, From Olympus to Calvary,' by Rev. E. F. Burr, D.D., author of 'Ecce Cœlum,' 'Pater Mundi,' &c.; and 'The Science of Life: or, Animal and Vegetable Biology,' by J. H. Wythe, M.D., author of 'Agreement of Science and Revelation,' 'The Microscope,' &c.

Mr. James T. Fields' residence in Boston, which he has occupied for a quarter of a century, contains ten thousand volumes. He has many literary curiosities, including original manuscripts by Thackeray, Dickens, Hawthorne and Whittier; books once belonging to great authors and having their pencillings on the margins; a copy of Boccaccio (printed 1684,) given by Leigh Hunt to his wife; Charles Lamb's copy of Pope's 'Rape of the Lock;' Southey's copy of 'Ben Jonson,' marked by Coleridge, and other books equally valuable.

Messrs. Putnam's Sons, New York, have just issued the first three volumes of their new illustrated 'Geoffrey Crayon Edition' of the works of Washington Irving—viz. 'Knickerbocker's History of New York,' 'The Sketch-Book of Geoffrey Crayon, Gent.,' and 'Bracebridge Hall; or, The Humourists.' Among forthcoming publications of this firm will be Bayard's Taylor's posthumous volume of 'Critical Essays and Literary Notes,' edited by Marie Taylor, containing 'Days in Weimar,' and the paper on 'Literature as an Art,' as well as reviews of many leading German, French, and English writers, including Tennyson, Victor Hugo, Freiligrath, Thackeray, George Sand, and George Eliot. They will publish immediately, 'Free Trade and Free Land,' by S. S. Cox, author of 'A Search for Winter Sunbeams,' and an octavo pamphlet, 'William Ellery Channing: His Opinions, Genius, and Character,' by Henry W. Bellows, D.D. Messrs. Putnam's also announce a series of novels to be called the 'Trans-Atlantic Series of Foreign Fiction,' to be both in cloth and paper, and to resemble their popular 'Knickerbocker Novels.' The first volume of the series will be a translation of Théophile Gautier's 'Le Capitaine Fracasse.' The same firm have now ready, as an addition to medical literature, 'The Human Eye, in its Normal and Pathological Conditions,' by Professor Alt, of Toronto.

Mr. Charles A. Scott, Pittsburgh, Penn., announces, for early issue, a volume entitled 'The Land of Sojourn; or, Sketches of Patriarchal Life and Times,' by John Scott, D.D., author of 'Pulpit Echoes,' and editor of the *U.S. Methodist Recorder*, with an introduction by the late Alexander Clark, D.D.

Edgar Allan Poe's writings and life seem to be a subject of increasing interest. Mr. W. J. Widdleton, New York, will publish, at once, the fifth edition of W. F. Gill's 'Life of Poe,' in which he has amplified the original volume by copious notes and letters in facsimile. Mr.

Richard H. Stoddard is writing a new memoir of the poet, also for Mr. Widdleton, as a prefix to a new 'Household' edition; and Mr. Edmund Clarence Stedman contributes to this month's number of *Scribner's Magazine* a critical essay on Edgar Allan Poe, which is accompanied by a portrait never before published.

Messrs. Charles Scribner's Sons, New York, will publish soon a new book of European travel, by Marion Harland, entitled 'Loiterings in Pleasant Paths.' They also promise, during the spring, a complete collection of the poems of Mr. Richard Henry Stoddard.

The Californian is the title of a new magazine published by the A. Roman Pub. Co., San Francisco, of which four numbers have been issued. OBITUARY.

We regret to announce the death of Mr. John King, a well-known London printer, in whose office the first meeting of the Printers' Pension Society was held.

Dr. Raleigh, the eminent Nonconformist minister of Kensington, whose death is just announced, was the author of several popular theological works.

Mr. George Grossmith, the well-known public reader and lecturer, died very suddenly on Saturday night. He was presiding at the usual 'house dinner' of the Savage Club, Adelphi Terrace, and had just recited an amusing scene, called 'An Incident in the Life of the late Serjeant Talfourd,' when he was seized with apoplexy. Several medical gentlemen were soon present, but Mr. Grossmith died in about three hours.

Mr. Nicholas Mitchell, who had obtained some literary reputation as the author of 'Ruins of Many Lands,' 'The Poetry of Creation,' and other poems, died on April 6, at his residence, Falmouth, aged 71.

The death is announced, at the age of 67, of Mr. Robert Fortune, an eminent botanist and Chinese traveller. Mr. Fortune was in 1842 appointed by the Horticultural Society of London to be collector of plants in Northern China, and between that year and 1856 he made several adventurous journeys in China, and obtained much valuable information respecting the tea plant. His 'Three Years' Wanderings in China' published in 1847, attracted much attention at the time, and he subsequently published works entitled 'Two Visits to the Tea Countries of China,' and 'Residence among the Chinese: Inland, on the Coast, and at Sea.' Mr. Fortune had been a frequent contributor to the columns of the *Athenæum*, but his latest important work was published in 1863. It was entitled 'Yedo and Peking, a Narrative of a Journey to the Capitals of Japan and China,' and devotes special attention to the natural productions and agriculture of the districts visited.

The death is announced at Boston, U.S., at the age of 74, of the Rev. George Punchard, known as the author of 'A History of Congregationalism.' He was for ten years one of the editors and publishers of the *Boston Traveller*, which he founded in 1845.

The death is announced at Berlin of Professor Buschmann, the oldest keeper of the Royal Library there—an institution which, though not exempt from the vexatiously roundabout methods dear to Prussian bureaucracy, seeks to perform on a smaller scale for Berlin what the British Museum accomplishes for London. Born in 1805 at Magdeburg, Professor Buschmann first studied here under Bopp Boeckh and other renowned philologists, and then passed two years as tutor in a German family in Mexico, where he seized the opportunity of investigating the relics of the Aztec tongues. Returning to Berlin, he acted as a kind of private secretary to Alexander von Humboldt, whose 'Kosmos,' among other things, he indexed—a work which Buschmann modestly declared to be the most important he ever did. He also helped Wilhelm von Humboldt to compose his treatise on 'The Kawi Tongue and the Island of Java.' As a keeper of the Royal Library since 1832, Professor Buschmann has substantially impressed his compilatory talents on the alphabetical catalogue, while the proceedings of the Academy of Sciences likewise record many proofs of his great linguistic acquirements.

The well-known Social-Democrat, Bracke, died at Brunswick on the 13th of April. He had been member for the Glauchau-Meerane district in Saxony, in the last Reichstag. He was a bookseller, and although not yet 38 years of age, was one of the prominent leaders in the Social-Democrat agitation.

[BOOKS RECEIVED:—

From the 'Bazaar' Office.—'Baughan's Winter Havens in the Sunny South.' A kind of guide, with tinted illustrations, to the Riviera and to Alassio. The chapters are headed Cannes—which, by the way, has had no end of fine people this last winter;—Nice (*Nizza*); Monaco; Bordighera; San Remo; Pegli, and Genoa.

From Mr. Alexander Gardner, Paisley.—'Modern Domestic Cookery,' by Jenny Wren. This work includes bills of fare for all classes. It is thus divided—Chemistry of food, cost of dinners, &c., cooks' kalendar; soups and soup-making; fish and fish cookery; made dishes, entrées; large joints; pies and pie making; game and poultry; cold meat; vegetables; salads; sweets, ices; bread and pastry; jams and jellies, sauces, seasonings; pickling, &c. The matter is taken from a British point of view, as will be seen from the expression 'dinner (*sic*) à la Russe.' However, the book is a practical manual, and will be useful to many.

From Messrs. W. and A. K. Johnston.—'Zoology,' Sheets III. and IV., by Dr. A. Wilson. Each 'sheet' consists of two sheets each 42 inches by 25. That on *Molluscoida* and *Mollusca*, (with its handbook in crown 8vo.) gives thirty-five coloured figures of examples; that on *Vertebrata* has also its thirty-five coloured examples besides handbook. The letterpress in each case very sensibly begins by telling the learner the origin—and meaning—of the terms *mollusca* and *vertebrata*; of which, of course, a snail and a sprat are familiar examples, respectively.

From Messrs. Sampson Low, Marston, & Co.—'Communism and Socialism,' by T. D. Woolsey. Needs no recommendation to readers of Mr. Woolsey's other works. But it has a general interest which might not be suspected. Among the contents are an account of the International, extending to thirty pages; we have also Baboeuf's conspiracy, Antonelli, Louis Blanc, Campanella, the Essenes, Fourier, Countess of Hatzfeld, Jäger, Lassalle, marriage, John Stuart Mill, Robert Owen, Plato, Pliny, St. Simon, &c., &c. To Lassalle and his theories alone some ten pages are given. Of him it may be that some of us never heard until the *Athenæum* devoted an article to a lady's book called *Meine Verbindung mit Lassalle*. English and French books tell us little about him. Mr. Woolsey, while an undoubted authority on matters of international law, at page 72 gives us a *dictum* that cannot be taken as absolute—'A man who is at once a scholar, an orator and a man of pleasure, cannot do much that will last.' What of Bolingbroke?

From the same.—'Horace Vernet—Paul Delaroche.' The new volume of illustrated biographies of the great artists consists of Mr. J. Runtz Rees' essays on Horace Vernet, and Paul Delaroche, with engravings of their most celebrated works, a folding plate of the hemicycle in the *Palais des beaux arts*, list of paintings, chronology, bibliography, index, &c.

From Messrs. Macmillan & Co.—'Hints to Housewives,' by Mrs. Frederick. We suppose this may be called a supplement to all cookery books of the better class; standing somewhat in the same relation to them that etiquette does towards education. A writer on etiquette has to take it that his hearers are educated, and Mrs. Frederick's book assumes that its readers will have a knowledge of ordinary cookery. Nevertheless, there are many useful receipts, with an index, besides the hints.

From Messrs. F. May & Co.—'British and Foreign

Press Guide.' A handy octavo of more than 250 pages, closely packed with information on metropolitan and provincial papers; giving towns of publication, statistics of newspapers and periodicals, advertisers' dictionary of representative organs, annuals, guides, directories and almanacs, diocesan church calendar, public associations, societies, &c., with their organs, reporting and telegraphing news agencies, press protection associations, continental journals, &c. &c.—a veritable *multum in parvo*.

From Messrs. Reeves & Turner, Chancery Lane.—'Facts and Suggestions as to the Law of Real Property,' by N. T. Lawrence. When a critic knows nothing about the subject of a book, which will sometimes happen, he has to go round the work like a cat round a bird cage, and see if he can master the contents. In this case we must just indicate the chief points. They are—sales; leases; mortgages; settlements and wills; reforms of the law historically treated; general register of deeds; difficulties of dealing with land; solicitors' charges, &c. &c.

From Messrs. Rogers' Engineering Library, Philadelphia.—'List of Periodical Engineering Literature prepared at the University of Pennsylvania,' by H. Haupt. An octavo of 81 pages, which will be of immense use to its particular public.

From Mr. E. Stanford.—'The Peninsular War,' by W. W. Northcott. A short sketch, chiefly intended for candidates at military examinations, for the most part a condensation of Napier's 'History of the Peninsular War.' It has twenty-two plans of sieges and battles, and is thus divided—Portugal, campaigns I., II.; Sir J. Moore's campaign; Massena's invasion of Portugal; campaign of 1812; Wellington in Spain, and in France; the Waterloo campaign; and is a most useful and businesslike compendium. It is a wholesome corrective of old habit that the battle of Vittoria is here called by the name of Vitoria. 'Vittoria,' of course, is an Italian word.

From the same.—Zimmern's 'Geography for little children.' A capital little book, for which the most fitting epithet would seem to be 'enlightened;' not merely in the plan of the letterpress, but in the engravings, which do most truly lighten the matter, to the eye and to the mind. Take this about glaciers as a sample:—

These ice rivers creep down the slopes of the mountains (or the intervals between them). . . . It is only by fixing sticks into them, and watching for weeks together how these sticks move onwards, that their advance can be proved.

How many grown-up people are there who can tell you so much off-hand? *Inter alia*, a river's *delta* is describe!), but the little book does not add that it is so called because the area occupied by the various outlets resembles a Greek *delta*, written Δ. Why a *volcano* is so named might also have been given.

From Messrs. Strahan & Co.—'Family Prayers and Sermon Book,' 2 vols. This handsome work, consisting of about 1,500 pages, small quarto, edited by Dean C. J. Vaughan, is designed for general use, but adapted especially for those who are prevented from attending public worship. Each morning and evening has its prayer, and each month has its sermons according to weeks, apparently three to a week. The binding is of extra cloth, panelled, and richly ornamented with gold, while the edges of the leaves are gilt over red with a handsome effect; altogether making the book an agreeable looking as well as suitable present for a household.

From the 'Times' Office.—'Eminent Persons.' This is a volume of biographies which have appeared in the *Times* from 1870 to 1879, commemorating rather more than fifty great names. In many cases there are two, and sometimes even three notices of one person, leading articles being given as well as the usual obituary notice. Of Mazzini, one sentence is perhaps worth quoting:

He was the man who 'ever troubled Israel' by his ceaseless efforts in the cause of Republicanism, and now at length he is at rest.

And on Harriet Martineau:

There is (*loquitur* Brougham) at Norwich a deaf girl who is doing more good than any man in the country.

And the *Times* itself concludes its notice thus:

If any lady of the nineteenth century in England or abroad, may be allowed put in a claim for the credit of not having lived in vain, that woman, we honestly believe, was Harriet Martineau.
